Recommended Temperature Zone: USDA: 10-12

Frost Tolerance: Needs protection on freezing nights

Heat Tolerance: Light shade or morning sun in summer

Sun Exposure: Light shade to full sun

Origin: South Africa (western Cape Province)

Growth Habits: Evergreen shrublet, to 2 feet tall (60 cm)

Watering Needs: Regular water in summer, keep on the dry side in winter when dormant

Propagation: Seeds, cuttings
